External

- · Social determinants of health
- Social hostility
- Ailing economy & job market
- Pervasive systemic racism and inequity
- The addiction crisis
- COVID-19 and its variants
- Stigma continues to block care
- Healthcare absorption of Behavioral Health
- Living in an information "Meta Verse"

Internal

- Evolving clinical model: social to medical
- Greater patient acuity
- Braided/collaborative care coming
- Reimburse: fee-for-service to value-based
- Parity violations
- Leadership transition (Progress = Change)
- Harm reduction as "recovery"
- Field consolidation: Mergers and acquisitions
- Patient agency
- Language: Person in Long-Term Recovery

The Longstanding Addiction Constants No Longer Constant

- 40.3 million with SUD in 2020 *Doubled
- 100,000 overdose deaths
 - Up 31% and approaching 300 per day
 - Fentanyl is a killer
 - 50x stronger than heroin
 - 100x stronger than morphine
- 12 million drugs (Rx and illicit)
- 9.5 million misused opioids
- 9.3 million misused prescriptions
- 18.4 million misused illicit drugs
- 6.5 million with both alcohol use disorder and an illicit drug use disorder

- Out of 40.3 million with SUD
 - 28.3 million with AUD
 - 6.5 million drug & alcohol
- 95,000 people in the US died from effects of alcohol
- 60% of people report an increase in alcohol use during lockdowns
- Alcohol use among women rose 41%


Society is Far Less Healthy

60% less likely to have deep recurrent major depression







