

NAATP Quality Assurance 2016-2021

- Jan-2016: Ethics Complaint Process
- Jul-2017: NAATP QA Initiative Launched
- Sep-2017: Google Restricts AdWords
- Jan-2018: NAATP Released Ethics "2.0"
 - 78 Facilities not Renewed
 - Revised Complaint Process
 - Updated Membership conditions
- Mar-2018: Treatment Discernment Guide
- Jul-2018: NAATP Congressional Testimony

- Jan-2019: Accreditation Requirement
- Mar-2019: Released Ethics "2.5"
- Mar-2019: Released of Outcomes Toolkit



- Click to call Ads
 - On Mobile devices
 - Targeting brand names
 - Not part of Google restricted Terms
 - Not covered by LegitScript
- Same Behaviors Seen Prior Google Ads Ban
 - Report Ad to <u>Google</u>
 - Report to <u>LegitScript</u>
 - May be Certified with different landing page
 - Report to <u>Federal Trade Commission</u>








Epicenter: PBC Opioid Overdose Deaths 2017-2020

PBC Medical Examiner Data:

- 2017: 647 Opioid OD Deaths
- 2018: 401 Opioid OD Deaths
 - 38% decrease over 2017
- 2019: 447 Opioid OD Deaths (*Fentanyl present 375 = 84%*)
- 2020: 568 Opioid OD Deaths (Fentanyl present 543= 95%)
 - 21% increase over 2019
 - 30% increase over 2018



Delray Beach, Florida

Delray Beach: Population 69,359

- 2015: 112 Opioid Overdoses
- 2016: 482 Opioid Overdoses
- 2017: 549 Opioid Overdoses (57 total yearly deaths)
- 2018: 194 Opioid Overdoses (30 total yearly deaths)
- 2019: 225 Opioid Overdoses (45 total yearly deaths)
- 2020: 373 Opioid Overdoses (63 total yearly deaths)

Turning around?

First 9 months of 2021: 211 Overdoses (22 deaths)
(First 9 months of 2020: 295 Overdoses (48 deaths))
29% decrease in overdoses/ 54% decrease in OD deaths






"The Florida Model" (In Theory)





How We Got Here: Access Without Oversight

Parity and ACA opened the floodgates of insurance money for addiction treatment. The FHA and ADA created an unregulated sober



Unfortunately, these laws did nothing to add any oversight or quality standards to an industry divorced from other healthcare.



ADDITIONAL SCAMS



- Provider/Sober Home kickbacks to residents: free rent, cigarettes, gift cards, scooters, acupuncture, pedicure and manicure, chiropractor, X-Box, gym memberships, etc.
- Fraudulent lab urinalyses e.g., apple juice, former clients, etc.
- Allergy and genetic testing, brain mapping.
- Signing a patient up for the ACA insurance exchange and paying the first few premiums.



TOOLBOX

Patient Brokering Statute

- No person may offer, pay, solicit or receive a kickback, bribe, commission or split fee in exchange for inducing a referral or rewarding a referral of a patient to a treatment facility.
- Certain exceptions apply (Federal Anti-Kickback safe harbors)

Deceptive Marketing Practices

• Marketers cannot misrepresent products, goods, services, or geographic location – including media and on-line.

Voluntary Certification Statute

 Referrals to and from sober homes and treatment facilities require standards for the protection of the residents.

Local Zoning/Reasonable Accommodation

 Require Sober Homes to be certified or otherwise have national standards when requesting reasonable accommodation to house unrelated adults in excess of the number allowed in residential areas.



Fixing The System Providers and Insurance Companies

Reform the Fee for service model

- Current system encourages overutilization of services
- Encourages fraud
- Encourages relapse (economic model)
- However, in-network bundled services must be adequate.

Best practice: Long term continuum of care

- Reward/encourage positive outcomes
- ACA Medicare model: Stop rewarding failure

Best practice: Combine primary care with communicable disease and behavioral health care (Triple Aim)

Best practice: Safe and sober housing is key

 All recovery housing be required to adopt best practices/standards – Oxford House, NARR

Cost benefit – relapse vs. recovery

SAMHSA/ASAM: Evidence Based Best Practices




Certification of Sober Homes 101: Florida Model



- Legislature tasks state agency to designate a certifying entity, setting forth general standards. (e.g., NARR affiliate)
- Referrals to and from treatment providers are illegal unless the sober home holds a valid certification.
- Sober Homes that do not refer or accept referrals are not required to be certified.
- Certain exemptions are recognized (e.g., Oxford House, Recovery

Local Zoning -Reasonable Accommodation



ADA/FHA protections


Cannot ban a Sober Home that is the functional equivalent to a family dwelling

Cannot deny a reasonable accommodation: Number of unrelated adults allowed in residential neighborhoods.

Protection of vulnerable residents in homes

Rights are not unlimited

- Clustering
- FARR certification/National standards
- Delray Beach Study/Ordinance: Reasonable accommodation requiring certification or Oxford Charter
- Oversight that is rationally based and narrowly tailored
