Enrollment Criteria







01

Age

Participants had to be at least 18 years of age

02

Treatment Program

Participants had to be voluntarily enrolled in inpatient treatment

03

Survey Completion

Participants had to complete an intake survey



Timeline

748 participants are enrolled in the pilot study

February 2017

OPP Toolkit and Final Report distributed to NAATP members

March 2019



Data collection begins at eight pilot sites

April 2018

Follow-up data collection (1-, 3-, 6-, 9-, and 12-month) is complete

Measure long-term outcomes for patients who receive inpatient treatment for a substance use disorder






748 participants enrolled in the OPP






47% were employed








Follow-up rates varied across treatment facilities and time points






Participants found treatment to be very helpful





A majority of participants reached forfollow-up reported being abstinent at each time point





Limitations



Not all participants were reached for follow-up


Although many providers conduct participant outcomes research, there is not currently a nationwide standard for treatment providers to collect common data.

NAATP's goal is help close the gap in treatment outcomes research by offering standard tools and processes.

Why Collect Outcome Data?






Implementation Case Study: Sundown M Ranch



Our organization has clear plans for ethical engagement with participants and clear research plans



Sundown M Ranch

Analyze the project from beginning to end—including staffing, and your use of paper/electronic data gathering



Our organization has the infrastructure and staffing necessary for this work



Sundown M Ranch

Pick your existing staff carefully, and determine the value of hiring more FTEs vs outsourcing



Our organization has data management systems in place and clear plans for collecting data



Sundown M Ranch

Prioritize the work for staff and ensure effective time management.



If necessary, our organization has identified research partners to help with our outcomes program
